Welcome, welcome everyone to the Metropolitan Museum of Natural History. I am glad to see such a nice crowd this evening, your schools would be proud. Ahem, sir and madam in the back – if you don't mind! So you've all come to see the new exhibit! (*Clapping hands*) well lets get right to it then shall we. My name is Jay Stephen Green III, and on behalf of the museum and the History Channel, who have jointly curetted this exhibit, I welcome you all to the History of the Jewish People.

Walks and lectures to the air You see the Jewish people are perhaps the most fascinating people ever to have lived. In this museum you will find artifacts from civilizations long gone. Tonight we will delve into their history and their culture. We will examine some of the things that made the Jews special but also some of their greatest downfalls.

We have in this collection over 1000 authentic Jewish artifacts. If you follow me you will see over here an authentic Jewish Yarmulkah... This Yarmulkah as it is sometimes called is known by many other names, such as Kippah, Beini, skull cap and the ever popular JewCap....

No one is quite sure why the Jews had to wear such a thing. It was often the cause of many problems since it made a jew stand out as different. Some scholars suggest that the reasons Jews wore this hat was in order to constantly remind them of their belief in G-d and of the responsibility which that held. Others suggested the origin is more closely tied to the idea that at one point in time all male Jews had small protrusions from the top of their heads, resembling small horns, that this Yarmulka was designed to hide.

Most scholars think that the Jews were led out of Egypt by a man named Moses. According to the ancient Jewish Bible, It was at that time when one of the most unique events happened in Human history. G-d spoke to the Jews at Mount Sinai. Of some 1900 religions in the world, Judaism is the only one to claim National Revelation, meaning that every single man women and child spoke to G-d. It represented the Flame of tradition that we managed to pass on each time we faced the Flames of destruction. <u>It cut through the thick darkness of assimilation and reminded us that WE ARE JEWS.</u>

As he lights the menorah ...

Soon I will pass from this earth and will be gone FOREVER. I will light this menorah tonight perhaps for the last time... I am the last living Jew....

IMPORTANT: Lights fade out AS DOVI continues to light to all 8 candles... holds the candles high...then blows them out... DARKNESS FOR 3 SECONDS.
